

Gender Pay Gap Report

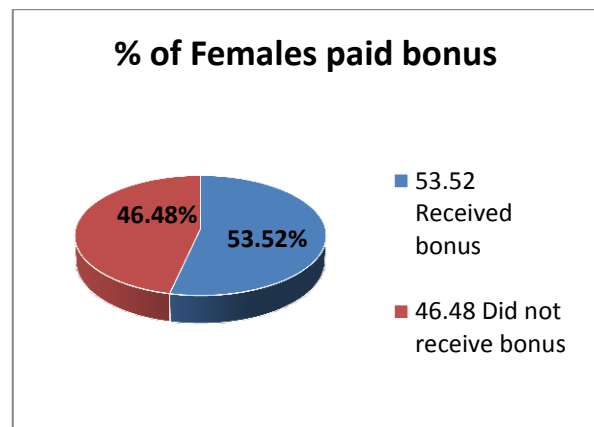
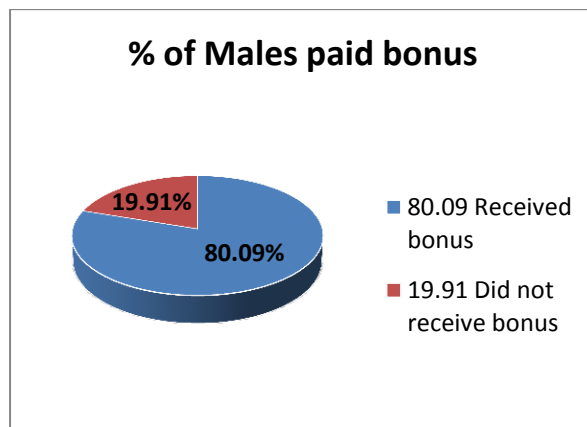

The gender pay gap is the difference between the mean or median hourly rate of pay that male and female colleagues receive.

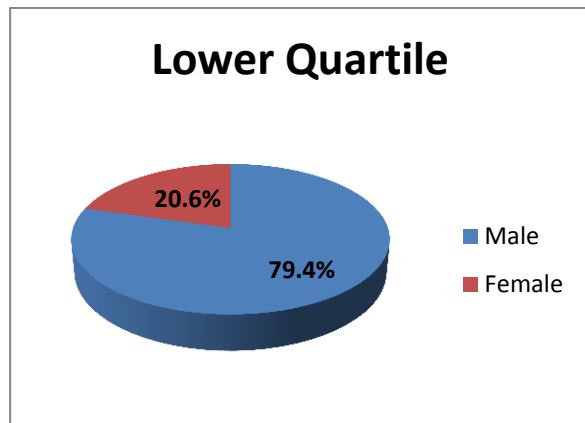
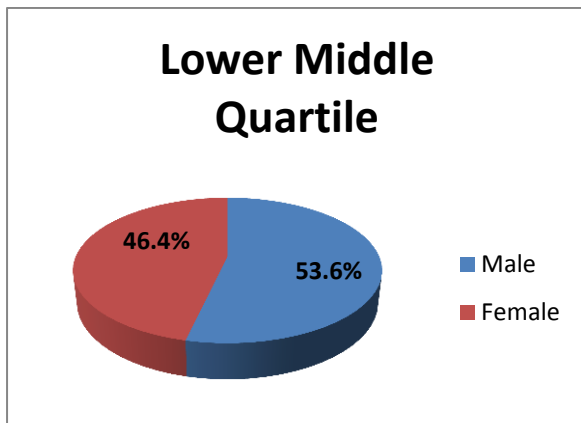
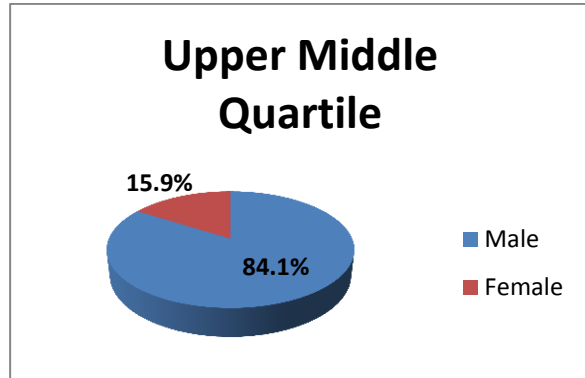
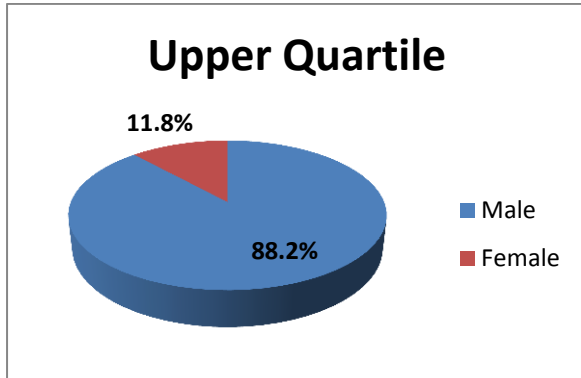
